he ProQuartet-European Center for Chamber Music Association (CEMC) has been committed to promoting string quartet and chamber music since its foundation in 1987.

It organizes concerts, promotes and commissions new works, high-level workshops, residencies for musicians and composers, outreach activities and training programs for amateur musicians.

The synergy of these activities has made it a unique force in the area of chamber music.

The European Center for Chamber Music (CEMC), founded in 1999, incorporates all the activities of the Association in France (Paris, Ile-de-France, Provence) and abroad.

The professional training and placement program

The professional training program is one of the Association's core activities, and helps to build ties between different generations of musicians. It consists in training courses, international exchange programs, offers of grants and periods in residence, concerts and outreach projects. The program is intended for all professional ensembles whatever their age and experience.

The teachers

Internationally recognized musicians, members and former members of some of the finest ensembles of their generation have been contributing to the sessions and Academies since 1987. They include members of the Kolisch, Amadeus, Juilliard, LaSalle, Alban Berg, Cleveland, Hagen, Artemis, Borromeo and Arditti Quartets, composers and artist-teachers such as György Kurtág, Eberhard Feltz and Ferenc Rados, as well as wind musicians such as Maurice Bourgue and the French clarinettist Pascal Moraguès.

Intended for: pre-formed string quartets and ensembles Aim: to develop the repertoire and prepare for competitions Venue: Domaine et golf de Pont-Royal, 13370 Mallemort (France) Duration: 8 days Presence required: throughout the academy Teaching: one 1-hour class a day for 6 days (classes begin one day after arrival) Number of participants per Academy: a maximum of 6 ensembles

Practical information

Enrolment

Selection for a first enrolment:

- application and audition (for musicians residing in the lle-de-France area)
- application information (for others)

Notification of selection will be made by e-mail. Admission to the courses is valid for an unlimited time. Applications are accepted throughout the entire season in accordance with availability.

Priority is given to early enrolment (before August 20, 2012).

Once every ensemble's program is approved, a convention is drawn up with the musicians.

Throughout the season, all participants can sit in on the classes as long as they reserve +33 (0)1 44 61 83 54/55.



Teaching fees

Enrolment fee € 20 per musician

Training courses in Paris

Academies in Provence

- Being enrolled in more than one session leads to a 15% reduction in tuition fees.
- For participants who are not entitled to any other fellowship: ProQuartet may grant the equivalent of 60% of teaching fees.

Residence at the Château de Lourmarin

The Robert Laurent-Vibert foundation, in partnership with ProQuartet-CEMC, offers three one-week residencies at the Château de Lourmarin (Vaucluse). Each quartet will play in a closing concert.

The ProQuartet ensemble in residence

The residence, which can last from one year to three, creates privileged ties between ProQuartet and the ensemble selected: production of concerts, outreach programs, availability of rehearsal rooms, residence with composers, etc.
